**Whereas** preserving and sustainably managing treed and forested lands provides environmental, agricultural, and climate resilience benefits; and

Tuesday, April 7, 2026

**Whereas** City of Kingston By-Law Number 2018-15, Tree By-Law, regulates the removal of trees within the municipality and is currently under review; and

**Whereas** the City is currently undertaking a comprehensive review of the City's planning framework through the preparation of the new Official Plan that will include updated policy direction respecting the protection and management of the City's tree canopy; and

**Whereas** farmers and rural landowners play a key role in preserving and maintaining forested lands; and

**Whereas** the Province of Ontario's Managed Forest Tax Incentive Program provides property tax reductions to eligible landowners; and

**Whereas** the provincial program is felt to be complex and administratively burdensome for participants; and

**Whereas** Council wishes to explore similar municipal incentives, both property tax and non-property tax based, recognizing legislative limits on property tax reductions;
